Taught in English, this unit is designed to help students with the challenges and opportunities of international mobility. It follows a **competency-based approach**, focusing on developing practical, intercultural, and reflective skills to succeed in unfamiliar academic, social, and professional environments abroad. It is designed for **foreign students** but also **French students** who are **thinking about an international expatriation** for the next semesters in one of our university partners, or just an international experience (internship in a foreign country, Volontariat International en Entreprise ou en Administration VIE/VIA).

Living abroad is often a rich and transformative experience; it can also present significant challenges, especially when one is unprepared. This course helps students deal with and anticipate those challenges by identifying and developing key competencies needed for a successful international experience. These competencies range from practical knowledge—such as administrative procedures and visa applications—to understanding the local educational and socio-economic context, and even to the influence of one's own behavior and mindset in cross-cultural interactions.

Compétences transversales / Transversal Competencies developed :

English : Improve oral and written communication in English in academic and professional contexts.

Professional insertion skills : Develop skills to improve internship application and insertion in a foreign context.

Autonomy and Initiative : Organize and plan administrative and logistical aspects of international mobility.

Intercultural behavioral skills : Analyze and adapt one's behavior in cross-cultural situations.

Communication : Communicate effectively across cultures, with attention to implicit norms and expectations.

Critical Thinking & Self-Awareness : Reflect on one's own cultural biases, strengths, and areas for improvement.
