





INTRODUCTION

The English program for **LLCER** gives students advanced knowledge of the Language, Literature and Civilizations of English-speaking countries:

- Language skills: literary English, designed for the world of teaching, research and culture, but also specialized English for corporate environments.
- Expertise in translation, both literary and specialized, with development in specialized modules.
- Advanced knowledge and understanding of literature, the arts and civilizations in the English-speaking world and the world in general thanks to minor and optional courses.
- Ability to **analyse** a literary or historic piece in English.

In addition to this core teaching, the degree is also designed to provide insight into other areas of the Arts, Literature and Languages field at the University of Nîmes (other LLCER and Applied Modern Literature programs). The variety of subjects tackled thanks to this structure makes it easy to change courses and offers a specialized course that encompasses a broader spectrum of general knowledge, in order to increase students' employment prospects.

Emphasis is placed on **pre-professionalization**, right from the first year, through talks from professionals working in publishing, journalism, teaching, tourism and heritage. The aim is to teach students about the real employment prospects open to them after the degree.
